

Chairman's Report

On behalf of the Board I am pleased to report on our achievements for the financial year ended September 2006.

This was a year in which the good work, achieved in the 2005 year, was further developed and enhanced.

The Board had, in the previous year, developed a strategic plan. That plan sets out a number of objectives and, both short term and long term, and steps to be taken to achieve implementation. Work has been done to further define the goals and action plans were also developed. In the coming year, it will be necessary to undertake a full view of that plan in order to determine whether any of the goals need to be amended or supplemented. The Board considers that the strategic plan is achieving its designated purpose; to focus the attention of the organisation on its main purposes, and to define the means by which they may be achieved. It is however a living document, and does require constant updating.

Further work was also done on the accounting and other management procedures for the organisation. In this regard our thanks must go to our auditors, Hayes Knight, to Paula Browning from Sports Auckland, and also to the assistance provided by Peter Ferguson from Squash New Zealand. The Board considers that the organisation now has very strong accounting and management procedures which enhance the professional attitude adopted by the organisation.

In our financials for the September year end, you will note a net deficit of \$10,429, against a budgeted profit of \$5,848. The deficit is, however, overstated. We have just received a grant of \$4,800 from Pub Charity, against some of the costs incurred in holding the Auckland Champs and PSA/Whisper events. However, because of the time taken by Pub Charity in dealing with the application, some of the expenditure was not incurred, and all else was handled in a different way. We are therefore in discussions with Pub Charity to determine exactly how much will be available to Squash Auckland. At the very least it will be not less than \$5,000, and,

perhaps, maybe substantially more.

In the last quarter we received substantial grants from trusts and other charities. As a result, Squash Auckland holds sufficient funds to pay the costs of the District Coach for the whole of the next financial year, and those of the General Manager and Support Officer for a substantial portion of that period. There is however, still considerable pressure on funds. The funds generated from trusts and charities are usually tagged funds, which can only be spent for particular defined purposes. However, for other activities, e.g. administration, management of competitions, the Board is totally dependent on the levies that it receives from the member clubs. Attempts to generate other sources of income have not proved successful. Accordingly the Board is seeking a further increase in levies for the forthcoming financial year to help fund growth and to provide a greater level of service.

Review of performance against goals and strategies:

Growth

We are pleased to report that for the 2005/2006 year squash playing numbers have stabilised for the first time in years. Now we want to increase the numbers and arrest the declining trend in the number of teams entered for both inter-club and graded teams events.

The Board in the current year undertook a major review of the micro court programme. New operators were engaged, existing courts were renovated and renewed, and a new court was purchased. Further, the whole programme was reviewed. Now the courts are operated in a particular area in conjunction with the local squash clubs with the intention that school children who participate in the micro court programme should be encouraged to join the local club and continue their development in the sport. A particular emphasis was undertaken in the Weymouth and Manurewa areas, and proved very successful. It is expected that similar endeavours will be undertaken in other areas of the Auckland district in the forthcoming year.

Best Practice

In this year we moved forward with the involvement of Squash Auckland in tournament processes. In particular, with the Auckland Champs and the PSA/Whisper events, management of the event was undertaken by Squash Auckland in conjunction with the North Shore Squash Club. The result was a very successful tournament with increased numbers of participants. A number of valuable lessons were learned and these undoubtedly will be implemented in the future.

The Squash Auckland website continues to be very popular with members and stake holders. Website unique visitors now exceed 21,072. Also, further emphasis is being placed on the use of the newsletters to endeavour to contact players and other interested parties. A programme of regular meetings with clubs has been implemented which is providing valuable feedback to the Board.



Performance

The District Coach, Brian Barnett, has had a very busy year. Unfortunately we lost the services of Mike Corbett, the Development Officer, during the year. To date that position has not been filled, but this will be an issue for the incoming Board. Melita Martorana (Support Officer) has continued to provide sterling service.

As most of you will now know, we have lost the services of Laurie French, the General Manager. He is returning to the Royal New Zealand Navy where he is to help develop an exciting new programme. He goes with the Board's full support and gratitude for a job well done. At the time of writing, applications to fill that position have been sought, and a number of applications received. A Board sub-committee is presently reviewing those applications and it is hoped that, by the time of the Annual General Meeting, a replacement appointment will either have been made or will be close. Changes are also underway with the Board itself. Three Board members (including myself) are not offering themselves for re-election at the Annual General Meeting. However we have been fortunate in being able to secure the services of Kirk Richardson, and Paul Cameron who have been appointed to the Board. In addition applications have been received for appointment from Bob Day (Red Beach), Paul Wright (Remuera) and Pam Gilbert (Panmure). There are no other applications so those persons will be elected unopposed.

I would like to offer a special thanks to the management team; Laurie French (General Manager), Brian Burnett (District Coach) and Melita Martorana (Support Officer) for their support to the Board and commitment to the job in hand. Also to the Board itself; June McCabe, Scott Harrison, Graeme Perry and Tim Marshall, my thanks for your voluntary contribution and input and support during the year.

To all players and squash supporters, I wish you all a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year and look forward to seeing you back on the courts next year.

General Manager's Report

I will remember 2006 for many reasons however the speed at which it has flown by will always remain with me. I believe this has been a pivotal year for Squash Auckland with many issues faced, some resolved and others still requiring attention. Overall, it has been a year in which many of our goals which were set in our strategic plan have been fully, or in some cases, partially completed across our three goals of Growth, Best Practice and Performance.

Growth — for those who are unaware competitive squash players in Auckland have been declining at a rate of 5-7% for several years. For 2006 Growth was more of a question of stopping the decline which has been achieved. Squash Auckland is now well placed to achieve its strategic goal of 5% increase each year through to 2010.

The successful funding, purchase and deployment of a fourth micro court has been both rewarding and challenging. The fourth court allows many more schools to be visited and also gives the office the chance to schedule some well overdue maintenance on the remaining courts and trailers. This too has also been funded through various charitable trusts.

Best Practice — Communication, Efficiency and Relationships form the cornerstone of this goal and considerable work has been carried out in this area. The growth of the T Newsletter to over 1000 recipients provides Squash Auckland with a direct link to club players who are keen to receive more information and updates on squash. The Club Update is now circulated to nearly 90 key squash administrators in the Auckland region keeping clubs aware of key dates and events. At the beginning of the 2006 FY the stretch target of 1 million website hits was set and it is pleasing to note this was achieved with over a month to spare and 1,065,000 hits achieved. This also reflects an increase in unique visitors to a peak of 2500 per month and is a strong tool for future sponsorship.

The introduction of the Council of Clubs and Club Representative Forum has allowed a communications channel between Squash Auckland and clubs at both the strategic and operational level.

Squash Auckland has now developed strong bonds with many key stakeholders such as Regional Sports Trusts, City Councils and suppliers of squash products. This has resulted in record levels of sponsorship including funding from some city councils.

District Coach's Report

Junior Development:

With the implementation of a long term, robust coaching structure, backed up by winning six junior national titles, Squash Auckland's junior squash is in good health.

2006 has seen Squash Auckland implement a far reaching coaching structure. Aged between seven and nineteen years of age, 80 juniors are training on a weekly or fortnightly basis. Many thanks to the National squash center, and both the North Shore and the Manurewa squash club's for facilitating the coaching.

Elite results offer great media coverage, PR opportunities and increased membership, all integral to our squash development in Auckland. Keeping in touch with modern squash and it's new benchmarks are essential.

The question is... how do we measure up to the current benchmarks?

At the recent 2006 World Junior Men's Squash Championships in Palmerston North, many of us had the privilege of seeing the "new benchmark", the new superstar of world squash.

His name... Ramy Ashour. His nationality... Egyptian. His complete game was sensational and would have his fellow countryman and our greatest NZ squash mentor and coach, Mohammed Dardir El Bakary, in squash raptures.

At eighteen years of age he has, twice won the world junior championship, reached the last eight in the 2006 Men's World Squash Open and was a British Open finalist. He is already a permanent fixture in the world's top ten players.

Although playing catch up, we have begun the journey by offering a long term coaching strategy in Squash Auckland. Now we must offer incentives, motivations and state-of-the-art knowledge to our 80 elite juniors who have goals of their own, allowing them to achieve the new... benchmarks.

The men's event saw a reversal in result of the last two years. Auckland's two time National champion, Kashif Shuja, could not quite complete his hat trick, going down in a seventy minute struggle to Waikato's, Callum O'Brien. Callum's intensity has improved out of sight, this, a testament to his European tour experience of the last two years.

Teams events are always difficult on completion of the individual championships. Fitness plays an important role in the demanding second week, with only the strong surviving. Both Auckland's, men's and women's senior teams proved to have the right stuff, acquitting themselves well bringing home both national titles.

Coach Development:

2006 has seen the implementation of "Get on the good Foot", a basic coaching course for parents to teach children the fundamentals of squash. This has been very successful with the Weymouth squash club being a "flagship" of fantastic internal coach development. This has led them to flourishing junior numbers and pennant results in the club.

With the emphasis this year being placed in developing a sound, long term, coaching structure for the players, next season a coaches infrastructure will take priority. Good coaches offering modern skills to enhance the overall standard of squash is essential. Squash coaches are integral to the future development of the game. In a country where winning talks and funding is based upon result, we must continually offer our coaches opportunities to "upskill".

In the 2006/2007 season we shall be working in tandem with Leigh Stacey of, the Millennium Institute, incorporating their LTAD training structure into our programs. This will streamline the physical training needs of our athletes while the mental skills required while be offered by Quantum Sports, Ken Youngsen. Quantum's, "Coaching the heart of the Player" offers life skills to young athletes, teaching them the attributes, where need be, to have a successful [sporting] life.

This opportunity to up skill will be offered to all coaches across the district. It is essential we all work together as coaches, watching carefully the benchmarks set by world top players and create a cohesive coaching structure with all participants pushing in the same direction.

Development Officer's Report

2006 has been a very good year for the development of squash. Having researched the last eight years in all aspects of Squash Auckland's history, a list of priorities was created to insure a long term development based on sound structures. To this end, the age old saying "the youth hold the future" was given priority.

Microcourts in Primary Schools

Many thousands of primary school children experienced the joys of squash on the micro court which was taken into the schools across the district.

A process of,

- micro court to schools.
- pupils are introduced through the micro court operator to the nearest club.
- the club offers the pupils a \$25.00 three month introductory membership.
- the club introduces them to junior coaching and the J grade one day series.

This process will be introduced fully across the region with clear documentation regarding micro court squash and its implementation into schools.

Intermediate School Squash

Squash Auckland has taken on the role of organizing the Auckland Intermediate School zone championship across the district. This culminated in the Howick Intermediate School winning the boys championship and Baradene, the girls. The finals were hotly contested in a great spirit, with all finalist being regular participants in the Squash Auckland sanctioned junior tournament series. The intensity of competition within this age group bodes well for the future of Squash Auckland.

ASB College Sport Squash

In the very capable hands of, Collette Amai, the College sport secondary school competition is very healthy. ASB arrange some 1000 secondary school players in their competition. It is a goal for the 2007 season to have secondary school students channeled into your clubs to strengthen the player number and base for the future.

From seven to seventeen, we now have a system in place offering continuity in squash on every educational level. This structure has seen Squash

Auckland invited by Team Solutions, to lecture some 120 teachers on the art of squash coaching. Team Solutions combine squash with the Active Movement programs which SPARC stipulate for the health of our children in schools across the nation. After one year, we are at the "coal face", we must strike while the iron is hot. With 120 teachers knowing how to coach squash, this will afford us 120 new micro court bookings. This means possible introduction of squash to 2000 new pupils. With the recent arrival of our new micro court this exciting development could not have come at a more opportune moment.

With Out Exception, is a SPARC stipulation which says you must offer your code to all communities without prejudice. Special Olympics New Zealand, were very helpful in our offer of placing the micro court into schools for children with disability. Mt Richmond, Arohanui and Westbridge schools took up the offer. It is both heart wrenching and extremely rewarding watching these children achieve, on their levels, and feel part of the wider community. To this end we set up a tournament for players with disability at the 2006 Auckland Junior aged group championships. This initiative has the Regional Sport Trusts seeing Squash Auckland as an innovative association who will go the extra mile and fulfill the SPARC, without exception, clause. This initiative is what open the door to Team Solutions allowing us the above opportunity. We have developed stature and profile at RST level.

2007 Club development

Clubs are our stakeholders. Squash Auckland is charged with offering service and structure to the game across the region. With robust base structures in place, we can now turn our attentions to offering the clubs, membership growth through the secondary schools.

We will arrange programs along the same line as the micro court projects to have secondary school students introduced to squash. Integral to this development is making the game attractive to youngsters by offering modern, color, fun, aural and visual attractions. We must make squash as attractive and as "funky" as all the "xtreme" street sports, which the youngster all aspire to.

Squash Auckland will offer events to each club. One event per quarter culminating in the Strongest Club in Auckland, a district wide Teams Event.

- First quarter: Squash coaching of parents and clinic for players.
- Second Quarter Ladies Day. Squash – Beauty – Jewelry – Fashion.
- Third Quarter \$10 man. Pitting your skills against Auckland's best.
- Fourth Quarter Strongest Club in Auckland. District club team event.

Communication on a regular basis is essential. With either the manager or the SDO of Squash Auckland visiting your club quarterly, we will open a dialogue, with those clubs who wish to, and work together with your committee's on your issues. We all have varying point's of view on how the game must be developed, and develop it must. Time and technology moves faster than we imagine. Keeping abreast of this will become a priority for Squash Auckland creating a modern and functional code. This can only be done with constructive communication.

Coaching Coaches

With Squash Auckland having a very low representation on the national grading list in the U13 and 11 age groups, the development of club coaches will be a priority.

"Get on the Good Foot", a basic grass roots coaching course for parents will be offered to all clubs prior to the new season beginning. This will offer parents the opportunity to teach their children the correct basic squash techniques. From here the children can move

onto the club coach for more in depth knowledge about the game. For the club coaches Squash Auckland will be offering quarterly coaching seminars to up skill themselves.

This will be in combination with the Millennium Institutes LTAD fitness program and Quantum Sports "Coaching the heart of the Player" teaching life skills in sport. For those who wish to take the coaching onto a professional level, Squash NZ offer Level 1– 4 coaching courses on a regular basis.

It is essential for the future of the NZ high performance players that the information they receive offers them all the skills to be able to compete on the world stage with a knowledge of modern day all court squash. It begins with the J grade.

Running such a large event is not easy and the ground work for this event started in late 2005. Herne Bay / Ponsonby also provided an excellent facility for the E and F Grades which were required to be played elsewhere due to the large number of entries.

Masters Nationals Report

The 2006 Masters National Championships was held at the Geyser City Squash Club in Rotorua from 20th to 26th October. The Individual event was conducted over the first four days and the Teams event over the remaining three days.

Auckland was strongly represented across all the age groups and contested five of the twelve individual finals. In some very close and hotly contested matches, Lisa Cowlard (35+), Brian Barnett (50+), Richard Purser (60+) and Francy Stephenson (55+) were crowned Champions in their respective ages. 1. Statement of Accounting Policies

(i) Basis of Reporting

Squash Auckland Incorporated is an Incorporated Society and these Financial Statements have been prepared in accordance with S23(i) of the Incorporated Societies Act 1908.

The Incorporation qualifies for differential reporting exemptions based on the following criteria:

- The Incorporation is not large as defined in the New Zealand Institute of Chartered Accountants Framework for Differential Reporting in that the following apply:
 - a) Total revenue does not exceed \$20 million
 - b) Total assets do not exceed \$10 million
 - c) Total employees do not exceed 50

Measurement Basis

The Financial Statements have been prepared on the basis of historical cost with the exception of certain items for which specific accounting policies have been identified.

a) Valuation of Fixed Assets

Fixed Assets have been recorded at cost less depreciation

b) Depreciation

Depreciation has been calculated on a straight line basis which writes off the original cost of depreciable assets evenly over their expected useful economic lives.

The expected useful economic lives estimated for the major fixed assets categories are:

Office Equipment	5 years
Computer Equipment	3 years
Furniture & Fittings	5 years
Microcourts	5 years

Residual value is assumed to be nil in all cases.

c) Accounts Receivable

Accounts Receivable are shown at an amount which represents their estimated realisable value.

d) Goods and Services Tax

These Financial Statements have been prepared exclusive of Goods and Services Tax, with the exception of receivables and payables which include GST invoiced.




